Did You Know...

The Wisconsin District of Kiwanis International was formed on September 24, 1918. Upper Michigan was added to the Wisconsin District on November 27, 1920 to form the Wisconsin-Upper Michigan District we know today.

In June of 1918, Int'l President George F. Hixson (after whom the Hixson Fellowship is named) appointed E.A. Marthens of Milwaukee the first Governor of the District. The first convention convened in Milwaukee on September 24, 1918 with four accredited delegates representing Milwaukee, Racine, Oshkosh and Kenosha.

Through its history, the WI/UM District of Kiwanis has contributed greatly to the International organization. International Presidents John Moss (26-27), Joshua Johns (33-34), I.R. "Whitey" Witthuhn (61-62), and Bill Solberg (78-79), International Vice President J. Donovan Jackson (86-87) and International Trustee Will Sundt, (94-95) hail from our District. At the International Convention in June, 2004, we continued the tradition when **Case Van Kleef** of the Kiwanis Club of Plover was elected International President.
